

## **VICTORIAN MULLOWAY TAGGING**

# **Newsletter-January 2018**

Welcome to the first edition of the Victorian Mulloway Tagging Newsletter. The purpose of this newsletter is to provide anglers with a summary of the tag and recapture data collected across the state. This recreational tagging program is funded by the Victorian Fisheries Authority through Recreational Fishing License Fees, and will continue for the next three years. Since the project got under way in November 2017, we have provided tagging kits to 51 anglers. We consider this to be a good starting number but if you know of anyone that would make a valuable member of our tagging team, please let me know. We are particularly keen to hear from anglers that are interested in tagging and releasing mulloway from the marine waters and areas around Melbourne.

## **Tagged Fish**


Since the project kicked off, a total of 66 mulloway have been tagged which is an impressive start! Most fish have been tagged from the Glenelg River and the nearby beaches around Port MacDonell

in South East South Australia, while a smaller number have also been tagged from the Hopkins, Barwon, Ocean Grove beach and Patterson River. Tagging fish just over the border near Port MacDonnell is considered important, since spawning is likely to take place in these areas and may provide sources of recruitment for western Victorian mulloway stocks.

Tagged mulloway have ranged in length from 45.5 to 95.5 cm (Figure 1). The majority of fish tagged from Port MacDonnell beach (South East SA) and the Glenelg River have been below 80 cm, while some larger fish have been tagged from Ocean Grove Beach and the Barwon, Hopkins and Patterson rivers.

### Recaptures

In the very short time the project has been running, we have already recorded four recaptures which is quite amazing! Michael Gordon has been lucky enough to have two of his tagged fish recaptured. Michael tagged a 58 cm fish from the Glenelg River mouth and 42 days later, it was recaptured further up the Glenelg River near Princess Margaret Rose Caves by Kade Faulkner, measuring 59 cm. After travelling 14 km upstream, the fish was released back to the water. While moving only a short distance, it's expected that we'll see greater distances travelled as the project progresses.

Despite having only five fish being tagged in the Hopkins River so far, we have already recorded a recapture. The fish was caught by Shane Lowery at 74 cm and after 7 days, was caught again by Mark Hadden. Finally, we have also seen a recapture in the marine waters. Nigel Telford tagged a 71 cm mulloway at Danger Pt in South East SA and was caught from the same location 18 days later by Jamie Coates.

## Please tell your friends to look out for yellow tags!

If you are fortunate enough to catch a tagged mulloway, please record the tag number and total length of the fish and get in touch with us at Nature Glenelg Trust either by phone (0448 139 690) or email (<a href="mullowaytag@ngt.org.au">mullowaytag@ngt.org.au</a>). The tags are yellow, approximately 10 mm in length and should be located along the top of the body, just below the fourth dorsal spine.
